"It's interesting to view the seasons as they impact and change the region throughout the year. The difference between summer and winter affects not only the landscape, but also how we interact with our environment. 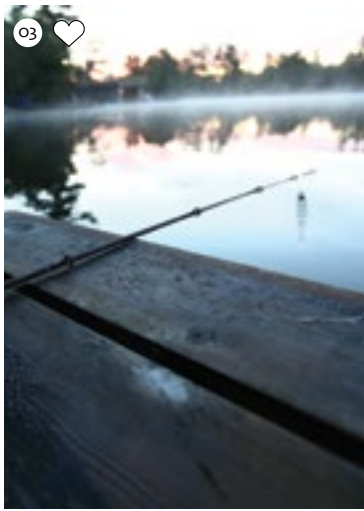
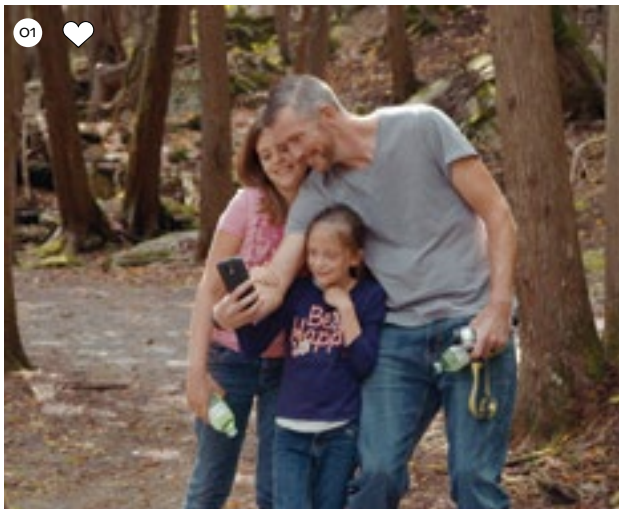
Real Nature

Mother Nature shows her true colours in the fall – follow our rural routes on a scenic tour - by motorcycle, car, boat or bike. There's nothing quite like a fall road trip in the Kawarthas.

Get Hooked

Our National Treasure

This engineering marvel is the highest hydraulic lift lock in the world, lifting boats 19.8 meters in the air providing a view like no other.

Opened with great fanfare in 1904, the Peterborough Lift Lock towers almost 20 m (65ft) above the Trent Canal. Powered by gravity it lifts two counter-balanced, bath-tub like chambers over an elevation that once would have required several locks to achieve.

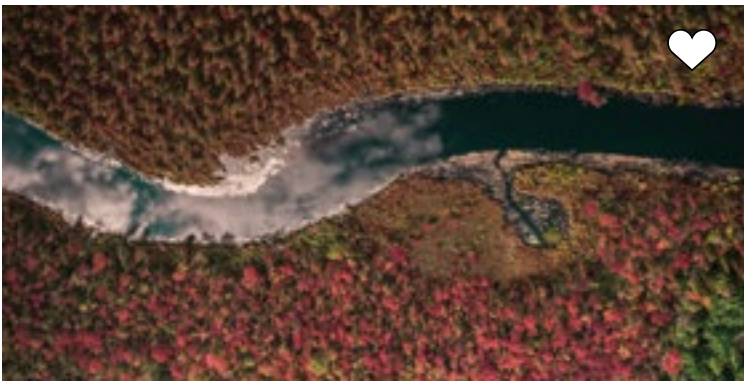

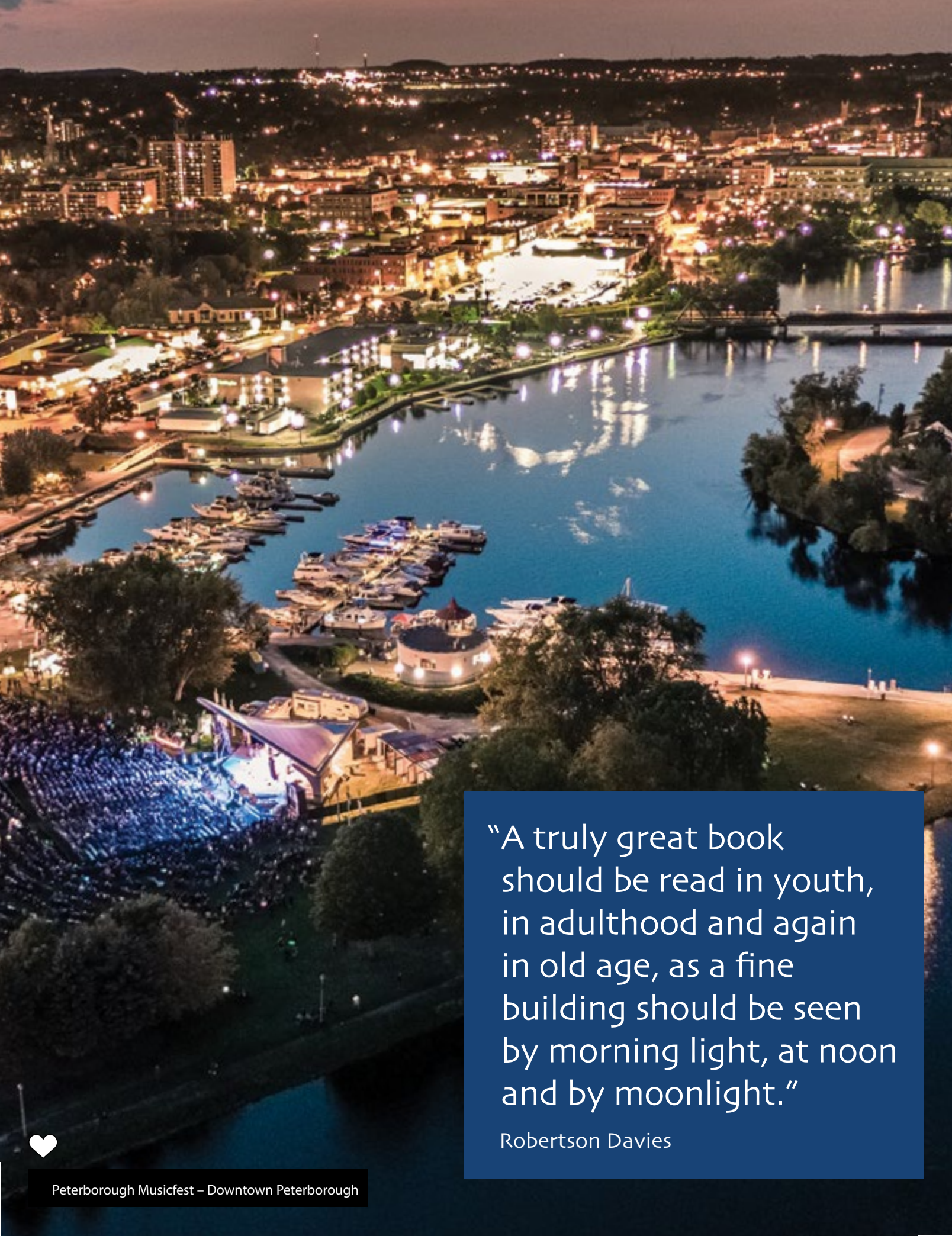

View the largest collection of canoes, kayaks and paddled watercraft in the world, learn about the rich canoe building culture in Peterborough & the Kawarthas and carve your own paddle at the Canadian Canoe Museum.

02 Carve out some “you” time at Zimart Rice Lake Gallery

This unique sculpture park is home to the most comprehensive, eclectic selection of Zimbabwean stone sculpture in Canada. It’s a must-see destination for art lovers of all ages. Meet the artist-in-residence, or take a class.

03 Have a Rock Solid Experience

At Petroglyphs Provincial Park, where you can view the largest known concentration of indigenous rock carvings in Canada. Hike the trails, enjoy the bright blue-green McGinnis Lake and learn traditions of the Ojibway people through the teachings of the Medicine Wheel.

04 Step Back in Time

Nature has always inspired creativity and innovation here - Idyllic, rural, and quintessentially Canadian, each year the 4th Line Theatre Company presents Canadian plays – written by and about Canadians. This magical theatre presents unforgettable outdoor theatrical experiences in July & August.

07 The Art of Entertainment

For a mid-sized city, Peterborough has big chops in the performing arts – from the historic Market Hall to the grand Showplace Performance Centre, there’s a never-ending supply of entertaining experiences for you and yours.

08 Art is in the Air

And on the walls of coffee shops and businesses, in small artist galleries, attics and studios, along trails, parks and rural roads. You won’t have a hard time finding a piece to take home, but you will have a hard time choosing!

Doug O’Neill’s travel credo goes something like this: “*The best way to connect with locals and tap into the ‘real flavour’ of a destination is to ask where you can get a hair cut, buy shoe laces, get a good coffee outside the city centre or what’s the shortest route to the bus depot. If none of those work, simply ask where you can buy an adaptor for your mobile phone. Trust me, you’ll be sent in every direction under the sun – and isn’t that the best way of discovering a place?*”

O’Neill, originally from a small Ontario hamlet called Phelpston (“it boasted a population of 139 when I left town after high school”) but now based in Toronto, also appreciates the benefit of having local connections. “If I catch wind that the second cousin of my neighbour’s daughter’s mechanic lives in a place, I’m on the phone the minute I arrive,” says O’Neill, who discovered (much to his surprise) that he had various connections to Peterborough & the Kawarthas which he’s been using to get the inside scoop on our region.

“My cousin ended up working in Peterborough for a while, my best friend went to Fleming College in Peterborough and ended up buying a house there, and one of my hiking pals is close friends with the owner of a local Peterborough cafe... Trust me, those connections are better than any guide book!”
